I am incredibly proud to call **Horizon Community School a life-changing force for the Marin City Community.**

Eight years ago, we made a **commitment to the families of Marin City** to help lift up the community through **quality early childhood education**. From the get-go, we knew Horizon Community School would be here for the long haul. We knew that an **impactful education** includes so much more than learning to read, write, add, subtract. It includes social and emotional growth; play and fun; warm and nurturing relationships with teachers; celebrating students' cultures, similarities and differences; healthy food and exercise; identifying and accessing care for learning differences; and advancing our teachers' careers.

We built this program with **intention**, and we have now built **our new campus** with the same level of **attentiveness and dedication**. Our new school, scheduled to open in January, represents the **deep roots we have cultivated in the community**—with our families and caregivers, students, staff, volunteers and donors.

How do I feel HCS's impact so deeply in my heart? I see it every day—the unique magic of HCS. I see it in the faces of our parents as they drop off their children each morning, feeling reassured and able to focus on their own studies or careers. I'm proud that our teacher turnover rate remains incredibly low, and that teachers return to HCS after having children of their own, choosing to continue building their careers here. I see our staff continually refining their teaching methods, inspired by professional development opportunities. I watch our families form a vibrant, supportive community, where they recognize and celebrate the beauty of their impact on one another.

And I see it in you, our dedicated supporters. Your respect, appreciation and commitment help make all of this possible.

I look forward to welcoming you all to our joyful and enduring new campus, complete with three classrooms, an administrative and parent education building, two state-of-the-art playgrounds and an edible garden for the students to nurture. I look forward to sharing with you the emotions and impact represented in our new home.

GRADUATE SPOTLIGHT MIRACLE WILLIAMS



Esther Williams enrolled her two-year-old daughter, Miracle, in Horizon Community School's inaugural class of twelve students in 2017. When HCS Program Director Angie Evans met with mom and toddler, she immediately knew that Miracle would be a great addition to the class. **Esther remembers Angie saying Miracle was just so easy to love.**

Over the course of that initial school year, Angie noticed Miracle not fully responding to teachers and students. She recommended that Esther take Miracle to have her hearing checked. After the hearing test came back as normal, **Angie arranged for an assessment with the Sausalito Marin City School District, and Miracle was eventually diagnosed with autism.**

From there, a path was put in place to provide Miracle with the best care and education possible. Through her preschool years, Miracle split her time between HCS and Marindale School. Marindale serves the needs of preschool children with learning differences and physical disabilities. **And HCS provided Esther and Miracle with a home base of security and advocacy.**









From Esther's vantage point, without HCS and Angie, Miracle's autism would have gone undiagnosed for a long time. "I had no idea. I didn't know how to look for anything—she's my baby. Angie cared enough to see the things we could not see. **Angie saved my baby; she saved me; she saved us."**

Autism isn't generally diagnosed until age four or five, depending on the severity. **HCS has the ability to recognize, intervene and procure a diagnosis for children and families** as early as two years old, allowing families to access the support they need in these critical early years. And Esther says, "How far could this have gone undiagnosed? My child would have been tagged as the 'bad kid.' Can you imagine the torture my daughter would have gone through? The damage would have been irreparable."

Now a fourth grader at Bel Aire Elementary School in Tiburon, Miracle has an individualized education program with a one-to-one aid who helps her with daily classroom support, including self-regulating, transitioning and behavioral challenges. She also receives speech and feeding therapy.

Esther says, **"My daughter is amazing to me. She is** on a great path. Early intervention is the key to navigating a life with autism." Five years after graduating from HCS, Esther still thinks of **HCS as "home, family and safety**...Angie has a gift. She guided me to get the services my daughter needed to survive and thrive in this world."





DR. SHAWN BRYANT FOUNDER, YES TO EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Dr. Shawn Bryant, founder of Yes To Early Childhood Education and expert in trauma-informed care, works with educators, parents and caregivers to help them best serve the children in their lives. **Trauma-informed care is a practice that empowers people who have experienced ongoing and profound difficulties** to understand their trauma and take action to repair their pain. Reparation allows them to provide happier and more fulfilling lives for themselves and the people they love and care for.


Over the past seven years, Shawn has been meeting with Horizon Community School families and teachers, **creating a safe space** for them to delve into specific issues the community experiences —issues like exclusion, financial difficulties and intergenerational family trauma. Two workshops are held monthly: one workshop for parents, grandparents and caregivers and a separate professional development workshop for HCS teachers and staff.

Shawn facilitates **conversations around historical, racial, educational and environmental traumas,** offering tools and practices each person can use to explore and understand their behavior and **learn to believe in themselves, their strengths, their gifts**. He inspires them to challenge, trust and forgive themselves, play with their children, improve their co-parenting and find and receive joy.

He imparts that **positive interactions matter and inspire change.** Shawn reflects, "I have watched families and teachers grow in confidence in how they parent and teach young children. They are visibly moved in our workshops. One experience I will remember forever was the evening I asked families to identify one thing they did well and could stand up and help other families to see these qualities in themselves. Families from under-resourced communities are not used to finding and locating their strengths. **This experience helps them find 'what's strong in me? What's strong in you?'''**

Shawn is struck by **HCS staff's commitment to their careers and community**, pointing out, "Over the past seven years, the staff turnover is maybe one percent. I see staff returning after having children. Teachers only return when their heads, hearts and hands align."

Empowerment workshops help disrupt the cycle of negativity and pain and help caregivers and teachers recognize, cultivate and utilize their innate talents and gifts. Programs like these are foundational to Horizon Community School's success. **Students from historically underresourced communities thrive when the role models in their lives thrive.** Preparing students to be academically and social-emotionally kindergarten-ready involves nurturing and lifting the entire family, the staff and the community.



2023-2024 represents our first full year of significant public funding. As a subcontractor with the Sausalito Marin City School District, Horizon Community School was approved as a California State Preschool Program (CSPP) serving children ages 3-5, and also received General Childcare & Development (CCTR) funds for services to toddlers.
